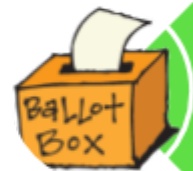




British Values at Green Park School



At Green Park School we are committed to serving the community and surrounding areas. We recognise the multi-cultural, multi-faith nature of the United Kingdom and strive to celebrate our diversity. We understand the crucial role schools play in promoting these values.



Democracy - children are elected to be class reps for the school council. We have visited the Houses of Parliament and have regular visits from local MPs. Pupils and parents have been involved in local campaigns to improve road safety.



Rule of Law - we have links with the local police and PCSO. We have a clearly structured behaviour policy underpinned by our core values. Restorative Principles allow children to see the impact of their actions and restore relationships positively. E-safety and personal safety are taught in PSHE.



Tolerance of different faiths and beliefs is taught through our RE and PSHE curriculum. We celebrate different faiths and cultures through special days and immersive learning. Staff and parents from different countries share their language and culture with the children.



Individual liberty - children have key leadership roles across the school such as School Leaders, Peer Tutors, Play Leaders and Sports Reps so all pupils have a voice. Children are encouraged to make the right choices to reflect their values and be responsible members of the community. Staff consistently provide boundaries and guidance so pupils can make safe choices. The school vision and mission reflects our core values.



Mutual respect - our core values are based around respect. Restorative Principles encourage pupils to build respectful relationships and use respectful conversations. Sports teams and clubs encourage respectful behaviour at all times. Respect is embedded in our behaviour agreements that are shared with parents.
