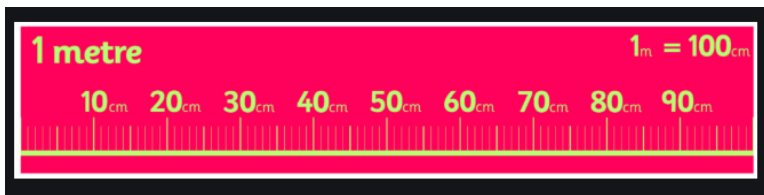

Can you find two things which are longer than a metre?



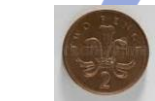
Maths treasure 2

Which is worth the least money?

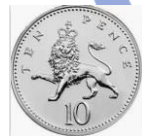


1 metre = 100cm
